At the New Jersey Council for the Humanities, we harness the power of the humanities to strengthen our pluralistic society.

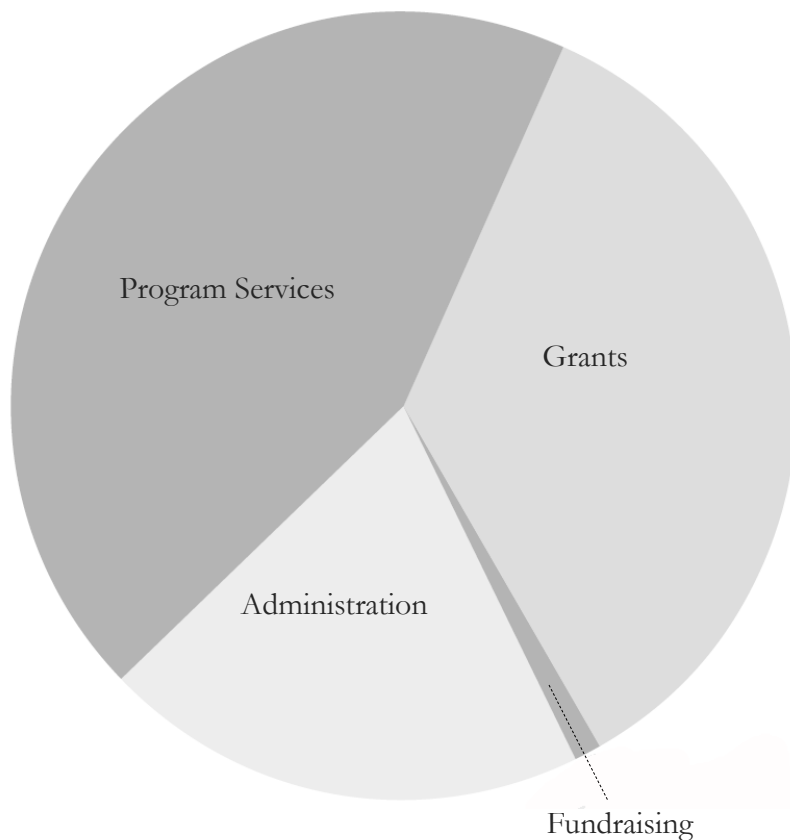
Our vision is a New Jersey that delights in diversity, appreciates that there are no easy answers, and finds joy and understanding in the humanities.

By enabling public programs and humanities experiences that deepen our understanding of ourselves and our world.

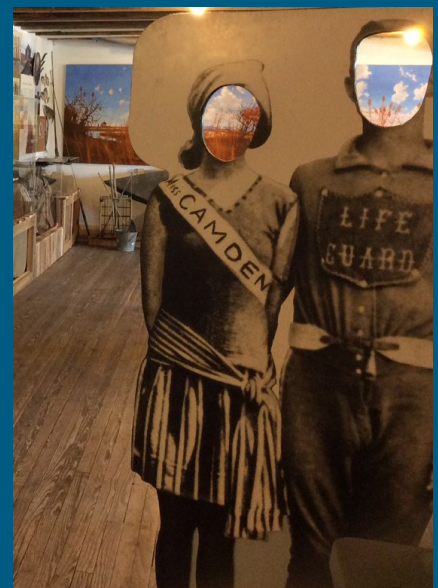
NJCH is a grantmaker, program provider, partner, convener, and innovator. We work with statewide and community organizations to bring dynamic programming to the local level.
