Time Commitment*

Humanities Lab is not a traditional grant program. Participants are required to attend cohort and individual meetings and to complete assignments between sessions. It is a significant investment of time between late May and September 2023 that includes individual and full cohort meetings, regular assignments, and submission of a final project plan and budget. Participating organizations may also pilot their new project in the six months following the program (October 2023-March 2024) with additional funding provided by NJCH.
