UNDERSTANDING OUR COMMUNITIES

AT NJCH, WE FOCUS ON PUBLIC HUMANITIES WORK THAT CENTERS LOCAL COMMUNITIES. THESE PROGRAMS ALL HELP MAKE NEW JERSEY COMMUNITIES STRONGER, ADDRESSING DIVISION AND ISOLATION ACROSS THE STATE.

COMMUNITY HISTORY PROGRAM

- Has helped dozens of NJ communities capture and share untold stories
- Provides humanities training to preserve, interpret, and amplify local history
- Provides funding to launch projects developed during the program
- Multiple projects are now sustainable, grant-funded efforts

INFORMED NJ

- Supported by a major grant from NJ Civic Information Consortium
- Funded the creation of a free, non-credit certificate in community journalism offered at four NJ community colleges, with plans for more
- Trained “community scribes” in six South Jersey towns to bolster understanding of local issues in partnership with the New School
- Working with South Jersey Information Equity Project as a part of the nationwide United We Stand initiative to address hate-based violence

HUMANITIES LAB

- Launched in 2023 to help organizations in all sectors experiment with and use the humanities to better achieve their own missions
- Uses the humanities to help organizations better understand those they serve
